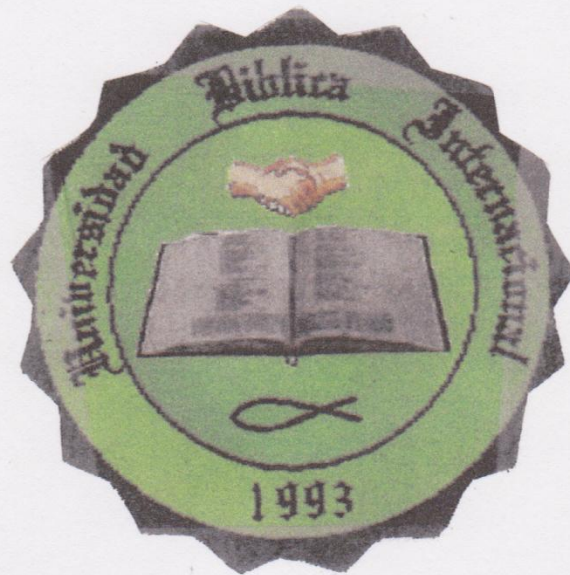


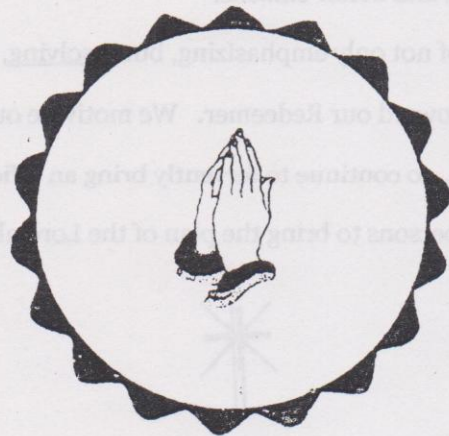

Nevertheless, the International Bible University recognizes that in today's society there are thousands of adults who do not have the accessibility of coming to the lecture halls of the University to attend classes because of time constraints, financial status, or geographic situation. The International Bible University offers an alternative to meet the needs of these adults, to allow them to continue with their studies. The mission of the International Bible University is to provide an alternative; a forum for the education of those persons who either work far or live far from the University. UNSATISFACTORY PROGRESS

Any undergraduate or graduate student whose cumulative grade point average drops below a 2.00 will be placed on academic probation. If the grade point average for the following term drops below 2.00 and or the student fails to raise his cumulative grade point average to 2.00 within two terms, the student will be placed in the non/degree certificate program or dismissed from college.





ACADEMIC COUNSELING

Most students are counseled privately by the instructor of the class when necessary. The administration is also available for academic counseling when requested by either the student, instructor, or the student's parents.

DRESS AND HAIR CODE

Men: Hair should be clean, neat and combed. Beards and mustaches will be allowed as long as they are kept well groomed. Clothes and shoes must be clean and have no holes.

Ladies: Hair should be clean, neat and combed. Dress should be attractive and modest. Make-up and jewelry must be worn with good taste and not in excess.

APPLICATION AND ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE

UNDERGRADUATE, GRADUATE, AND CERTIFICATE APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. Fill out the application form.
2. Write personal testimony (approximately 300 words).
3. Mail the application form, testimony, a recent photograph of you and your wife children, if and a \$25.00 non/refundable application fee to the registrar no later than one month prior to the first day of the semester. Late applicants must receive special permission for enrollment.
4. Have pastor or another responsible person complete the personal recommendation and mail it directly to the registrar.
5. Applicants in the process of completing admission requirements may enroll as special student for up to 12 credit hours. Admission must be completed before these credits will be recorded on official transcripts.

International Bible University selects the students carefully, without discriminating against race, creed, color, ethnic origin, or gender. Students who are mature and promise to reach their objectives and academic goal are accepted.

The administration of International Bible University will make an evaluation on the ability of the applicant. This is based on their academic accomplishments or works, workshops, seminars, labor, professional training, and experiences in their occupation.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

A maximum of two unexcused absences per class, per semester are permitted. The instructor for each course is granted discretion as to whether penalize students with unexcused absences by requiring extra make-up assignments, lowering the course grade, or not granting for the courses.

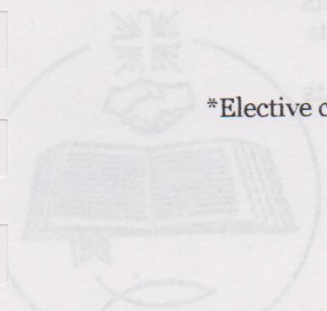

THE DEGREE PROGRAM OF INTERNATIONAL BIBLE UNIVERSITY

The Degree programs of International Bible University are designed solely for religious vocations and indented solely for the teaching of Christian principles in accordance with Biblical Scriptures.

METHOD OF STUDY

IBU has its Curriculum in an educational format for the students which includes corresponding by mail, telephone, e-mail, and fax. In some cases we will make arrangements for tutoring. All this is contingent on the financial situation of the student to pay these expenses.

The manner which IBU has its courses and curriculum prepared, the student can complete his course according to the time he dedicates to it. All of the courses are designated to fulfill the traditional requirements that are needed for work, in a manner designed so that the student will be enriched by the profound Theology solely taken from the Holy Bible and not from the dogma of men.

TUITION PAYMENT

INTERNATIONAL BIBLE UNIVERSITY is set up on a two/semester college year plus special summer classes. Tuition for each semester must be paid at the time of enrollment for each semester. A budget plan for tuition payments may arranged for full/time students who contact the accounting office prior to the opening of the school term. A \$25.00 late fee will be added for payments no receive on time. Students who are more than ten days late on any payment will not be allowed to continue their studies. There is a \$25.00 returned check fee for each non-cashable check.

No grades will be issued to students with unpaid balance, and no student will be permitted to register for a new term until all previous balances are settled. No student will be graduated until all tuition, fees and other charges are paid in full. To withdraw from the Institution a student must submit a written letter of withdrawal to the administration. Without such written notice, the student will be responsible for all tuition charges and grades for the semester.

The student may begin at any time, because the International Bible University has open registration. This permits everything to be much easier for the student, so that he might reach his proper goal. Nevertheless, the student should keep in mind that IBU expects from the student a reasonable progress within a certain time period.



ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

IBU reserves the right to suspend or terminate a student from any program for the following reasons:

1. If he does not submit his required assignments.
2. If within a period of 40 days not communicate with the University.
3. If he does not pay his monthly fees.
4. For falsification of his records or work submitted for credit.
5. For inadequate scholastic conduct.

CLASSIFICATION OF THE STUDENT

When the courses, transcripts, financial account and records of the student are completed, then the student be considered for matriculation from IBU.

REFUND POLICY

Students may receive full refunds for payments made for tuition for as established herein, provided that the request for the refund made up to four days after complete payments of fees for tuition are made. In addition, they must show appropriate cause such as illness, job loss, or any other cause that justifies the students withdrawal from courses to be taken.

THE FOLLOWING REFUND POLICY APPLIES:

1. First 3 days from the date of registration 100% refund.
2. 4 to 7 days from the date of registration 60% refund.
3. 8 to 14 days from the date of registration No refund.

The notification of cancellation should be done by certified mail. IBU will not make any refunds on application fees or materials.

TRANSFERABILITY AND LIFE EXPERIENCE CREDITS

It is the policy of International Bible University to consider for transfer credit earned in a regular college or university or other college-level institution. Courses acceptable for transfer must be similar in content to those replaced in the chosen program of study at the Institution. Courses which are not similar may be transferred if they are deemed to be beneficial to the students chosen ministry career. Only those credits which carry a grade of at least "C" or its equivalent may be transferred, in order to request consideration for life experience credits or for practicum credit, the applicant must submit a full resume showing dates of ministry and full responsibilities involve. Verification from a recognizable authority must accompany each ministry assignment.

Each institution of higher learning including Institution reserves its sovereign right to determine what credits it will transfer in toward its degree programs. Therefore, the Institution cannot represent that its credits will transfer. The student must make that determination by checking with the institution that they may want to transfer credits to.



CREDITS

IBU will consider and evaluate life experience credits through a special assessment. Pastors that have the experience as Pastors for years, if he can document his experience such as: letters of verification from the church that he has served, licenses, permits, samples of his work, certificates, awards, and honors as pastor or leader, newspaper articles, or evaluation of his performance.

SPANISH LEADERS

The Spanish speaking leaders do not have a program in large segment of the population. This population does not have the money to pay for higher education. They can work to make a living and at the same time gain skills by studying at home. The local students can attend classes the last Saturday of each month. They can also take work-study, to be done during the time they are not on campus. The students can contact us by telephone or fax in case they have question about their work-study. We encourage our students to register with the Public Library, to go the private rooms of the library to study there, and do research.

DISTANCE LEARNING

IBU studies to a large degree are by distance learning, however, local students will come to campus on a scheduled basis to attend the classes, receive their assignments, and turn in completed assignments.

IBU assigns a tutor to be in contact with the student by way of the Internet, Telephone, Fax, and regular mail. This allows the student to study as if they are attending the school campus full time. Upon completing their courses, the student receive their Diploma and Transcripts.



APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION

In order to be accepted as a student one should be a born again, Evangelical Christian, have some basic knowledge of the Bible, be active in Evangelical ministry, and should send in their admission application with the required information and nonrefundable application fee. The student will be responsible for purchasing their study materials. The application should be submitted as soon as possible to facilitate proper admission.

ACADEMIC UNITS

1 Semester credit equals 15 academic units or its equivalent.

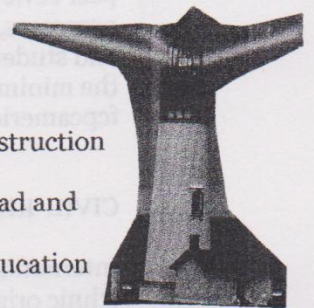
THE PHILOSOPHY OF INTERNATIONAL BIBLE UNIVERSITY

Our Philosophy is effective because it is Christ-centered. It is designed to develop an educational program through understanding of the Holy Scriptures within the calling of the student, and within the scholarship of the student.

The model of our education is completely taken from the Bible. It specifically deals with the gathering of knowledge by the student through lectures, assignments, textbooks, research, and thesis. International Bible University (IBU) specifically takes great care to insure that these projects cover all subjects, which the student needs to become very proficient in the field he has chosen in the ministry.

Knowledge without practicality and experience will be useless in the ministry. Our intention and goal are to help the student to develop all concepts learned in his studies and to put it into proper perspective to be of practical use. By doing this, the student will increase their effectiveness as an ambassador of our Savior Jesus Christ. It is our understanding that theological education is not just reading a book or attending classes. When the models of the Biblical education are properly maintained, it will produce a proficient ministry.

Our philosophy in the education of the student is the type of education that provides instruction through questions and answers, and the writing of dissertations. The student has to read and study the textbooks that we call "The 66 Curriculum" (The Bible). This is the type of education that we offer to the student through distance learning.





SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

International Bible University has its own scholarship program for the one that qualify.

TEXTBOOKS

The required textbooks and any future audio or video tapes are separate from the tuition. Our school maintains a stock of all required textbooks and questions.

REGISTRATION AND PAYMENTS PLANS

- Plan A. Registration and tuition paid in full. The students that enroll with this program will be given a special discount of 10% off the tuition. This is the best and economical option for the students that do not need the monthly program.
- Plan B. Using the monthly program. With this program the students proceed through with no delays. It is set up by making convenient monthly payment. The monthly program can be used to arrange for monthly, quarterly, or annual payments as agreed by contractual arrangement between UBI and the student.

SPOUSE DISCOUNT

If the spouse enrolls simultaneously (equal tuition), he/she will receive a 20% discount on the tuition. No discount on textbooks or other materials.

The CPCA is an educational association that provides experienced educational quality peer review of, faculty, academic curriculum and course development, distance learning processes, campus operations, catalogs, brochures, advertisement, application forms, financial, and student records and transcripts to the minimum CPCA standards. CPCA standards exceed the minimum standards of the State of Florida. For verification of all FPCA standards go to fpcamerica.org.

CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY

International Bible University admits male or female students of any race, color, nationality, or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded to students by our administrative or educational policies.



THE IBU STUDENT MONTHLY PROGRAM

IBU has its own Student monthly payment program. It works the following way:

The students manage the cost of continuing their education by making monthly, quarterly, or annual payments. IBU maintains these programs available at 0% interest. (The Holy Scripture mandates in Exodus 22:25 that a believer cannot charge another believer any type of interest.)

The students benefit from the monthly payment program of IBU because there is no interest, and the students will go to the ministry without the burden of loan.

DISTANCE EDUCATION

The students benefit from a great opportunity to complete his education through distance, learning and study. The distance learning is a great part of the American education system for more 200 years. Many successful pastors and ministers have found distance learning to be the best option for them for learning. The distance learning lets the students set his own pace. At the same time, the student is encouraged by IBU to spend as much time as he needs to fully understand any complex material. The student can progress through courses at an individual pace suited to his personal needs. IBU makes the student understand that whenever a subject fascinates them, they should spend extra time on it. The students are not rushed through because the class must move on at a different pace. IBU uses all means to make the students understand that distance learning is a great time saver. The student makes his own schedule. He can improve his own time. The program comes directly to his home. He does not have to travel. Such convenience!

AFFILIATIONS

IBU is a member of Global Gospel Outreach, a mission to the world, and International Association of Schools and Churches. The conviction of these two associations maintains the separation of church and state. It is the conviction of IBU to maintain the separation of church and state.

The sole purpose of International Bible University is to have an education for the gospel in the field of Christian ministry. IBU works freely with other churches, of which our students are members.

DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

We Believe: That the Bible is the Inspired Word of God; solely infallible and authorized by God. In One True God, eternally existing in Three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In the Deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, in His life without sin, in His vicarious death, in His corporal resurrection, His ascension to Heaven where He is seated at His Father's side, and in His personal return or Second Coming. In the salvation of the sinner. In resurrection by work of the Holy Spirit, allowing the person to live of intimate relationship with God. In the resurrection of both, those saved by the Lord Jesus Christ and those lost in sin. Those who have been saved, in the resurrection of life, and those lost, in the resurrection to condemnation.

THE ETHICS OF INTERNATIONAL BIBLE UNIVERSITY

- AP 400 Apologetics I 3 credits
 An introductory course in defending the Christian faith, the reasons Christians can offer for the hope that is in them.
- AP 401 Apologetics II 3 credits
 Thorough, incisive teaching on logical principles which can be applied to modern philosophy that provides a rational defense of Christianity and a critique of presuppositional apologetics.

BIBLE DOCTRINES

- BD 300 Christology 3 credits
 The person and work of Christ: The Christ of the Bible, The names of Christ, The states of Christ, The offices of Christ, Substitutionary Atonement of Christ, Why Did Christ Die?
- BD 310 Doctrine of Grace and Pauline Theology 3 credits
 The Apostle Paul's biblical position of salvation by grace through faith and that not of works. Looking at how the reformer Martin Luther capitalized on this Pauline Theology. Contrasting the former with the book of James to give balance and objectivity.
- BD 400 Demonology 3 credits
 The study of demons and their legions as found in the Bible from the advent of Lucifer including his fall with the fallen angels and their operations with ultimate fatal destruction.
- BD 410 Soteriology 3 credits
 The process of our salvation in Christ: Grace, Saving Faith, Justification By Faith Alone, Adoption and Union with Christ, Sanctification.
- BD 500 Angiology 3 credits
 In depth study of angels, principalities, rulers of darkness and spiritual hierarchy, fallen and risen. Cherubims, seraphims, and all angelic ranks known in post or pre-adamic civilization.
- BD 510 Pneumatology 3 credits
 The person and work of the Holy Spirit are analyzed in the Old and New Testament.

- BI 400 Dispensation, Ages, and Eschatology 3 credits
Introduction to cataclysmic ages, biblical eras, and theological phases of man's process of development biblically including end-time ideologies, pre-adamic civilization, and the pre-supposed influence of divine initiative.
- BI 410 Civil Religion and Current Position 3 credits
An exploration of civil religion in America with deistic fathers, the social gospel of Americans with students drawing their summations and conclusions of their impact.
- BI 500 Law and the Prophets 3 credits
How the ten commandments must become a dynamic force for change in the life of the individual Christian, the Church, and society. A look at this through the lives of the great prophets as recorded in their writings in the Bible.
- BI 510 Advanced Old Testament Studies 3 credits
An in depth exposition of the Old Testament books as they are sub-divided into the Tanak, Hagiographa, Torah, and Neviim encompassing the literary aspects and unique composition.

BI 520 Advanced New Testament Studies 3 credits

An in depth exposition of the New Testament books as they are sub-divided into the synoptic writings, Pauline and pastoral epistles, and eschatological writings encompassing the literary aspects and unique composition.

BI 530 Prophecy & Prophets 3 credits

A study of the prophets and prophecy including end-time prophecies, modern, and post modern interpretations of Bible prophecy.

BIBLE LANGUAGES

BL 400 Introduction to Hebrew 3 credits

A beginning analysis of elementary Hebrew including alphabet, vowels, nouns, particles, adjectives, and other parts of speech.

BL 405 Introduction to Aramaic 3 credits

The student focuses on learning the basics of Aramaic vocabulary and verbs in order to understand the very limited portions of the Bible written in this language.

BL 410 Introduction to Greek 3 credits

This course will provide an introductory study of Greek grammar, vocabulary, and syntax, which will acquaint the student with the essentials of New Testament Greek.

HERMENEUTICS

HE 300 Hermeneutics I 3 credits

A study of the methods and principles of Biblical interpretation giving particular attention to the nature and structure of Scripture, the unfolding character of revelation, prophecy, anthropology, symbolism, and parables.

HE 301 Hermeneutics II 3 credits

A continuation of HE 300 with additional focus on difficult passages and problem areas in interpretation being considered and explained.

HISTORY

HI 200 Church History I (from Genesis 1:1 to 1500) 3 credits

An overview of church history from the beginning of man up to 1500 AD.

HI 201 Biblical History 3 credits

An extensive discovery of biblical history as it relates to ancient civilization, culture, and people of color in particular.

HI 300 Church History I (from 1500 to present day) 3 credits

An overview of church history from 1500 AD up to the present day.

HI 305 Christian Fundamentalism 3 credits

A systematic survey of the essential beliefs of Christianity and the doctrines that surround Jesus Christ, virgin birth, vicarious death and resurrection, second coming, the Trinity.

HI 310 Hebrew and Early Christian History 3 credits

A survey of the Hebrew or Habiru Nomads of Abraham from the Sumerian civilization. The Hamurabi tablets, Horanian codes, Jewish Patriarchs, judges, monarchs, exilic periods, the Maccabeans, helenized Jews, and Roman period. Review of the ancient Persian (Iranian) influences upon Hebrew culture and the Bible.

HI 400 Social and Political Theory 3 credits

A survey of political and social theorists including Martin Luther King, Jr., Ghandi, and Malcolm X drawing biblical comparisons and contrasting ideologies.

BI 520 Advanced church and Denominations studies.

An in depth exposition of the church and Denominations.

A study of the minister and his work inside and outside

Of the church. A study of the essential beliefs of the ministry

For God and people.

MI 301 Comparative Religions II

3 credits

A continuation of MI 300 with a concentration and intense in depth study of a student chosen topic that has received administration approval.

MI 310 Missions I

3 credits

Study of missions from the Old Testament to the present day examining the work of proselyting of the world to Christianity via missions evangelism.

MI 311 Missions II

3 credits

The role and responsibility of churches and the individual Christian to participate in and support missions worldwide.

MI 400 Comparative Religion and Philosophy

3 credits

A continuation of MI 300 with an in depth study of the philosophical basis of two or more world religions of antiquity chosen by the student with administration approval.

THEOLOGY FROM THE BIBLE

6 credits

PR 500 This studies will be carried out under the supervision of faculty advisors with topic within the scope of student's major resulting in a completed major project and defense. And examining the theology directly from the Bible and others theology.

PSYCHOLOGY

PS 200 Comparative Science and Theology

3 credits

A condensed study of the physical and biological sciences contrasting evolution theory with the creation doctrine of Genesis in the Bible. Examining theories of astronomy and whether they are relative to theology of the Bible.

PS 230 Comparative Religion and Psychology

3 credits

A comprehensive survey of religion and psychology with William James' "Synthesis of Religion and Psychology".

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

MI 300 The Church and the Denominations II

6 credits

A study of the major world religions and Denominations, their founders, and their formation. Exploring their variegated philosophical models that define their uniqueness. And a study of their missions from the Old Testament to the present day via missions evangelism.

SOCIOLOGY

6 credits

PS 400 A condensed study of the society and a concentration of the theory of evolution and the creation and the doctrine of Genesis in the Bible. And a continuation of examining the theory of evolution and society in the light of the Bible's teachings so the student can effectively provide a biblical apologetic that provides truth to dispel error.

SPEECH

SP 200 Homiletics I

3 credits

Beginning study of the skills for the preparation and delivery biblical messages. Types of sermons and various delivery methods.

SP 300 Homiletics II

3 credits

A continuation of SP 200 with more in depth study of exegesis rather than eisegesis in preparing biblical messages to be delivered by various homiletical forms. Defining techniques for preaching with an ever present mind set of presenting Scripture within its natural context and avoiding pretext at all costs.

SP 400 Homiletics III

3 credits

A continuation of SP 300. This course builds upon SP 200 and SP 300 with a concentrated effort to help the student find and develop their best style and delivery method for maximum effectiveness in their ministry.
